



Karamoja Prayer Requests For February 2004

- Thank God that there have been no ambushes on the roads over the Christmas period and that students were able to return safely to their families for the Christmas holidays. Pray that they have safe journey back to college.
- Caleb the youth worker has helped to organise a youth training centre where young people can learn a trade. They have found three teachers to deliver lessons in tailoring, carpentry and building. Caleb also hopes to find teachers to teach agriculture and computer skills.

More funding is still required in order to pay the teachers for the first term. It is hoped that once the students begin their courses they will be able to contribute towards tuition fees for subsequent terms.

Caleb has specifically asked us to “pray that the vision for this school may come in implementation to help the youth ... we are doing it for the glory of God. Brothers, pray for us for that we get this money and see the school start on 2nd Feb. 2004”
